Re: Warwickshire 11+ Qualifying Scores – September 2015 Entry

You are receiving this letter as your child, CHILD, sat the Warwickshire 11+ test for 2015 entry. If you named a Warwickshire grammar school on your child's secondary school application, this information will explain how your application was considered and the criteria used when making offers of grammar school places.

This information should be considered along with your secondary school offer letter, which will be sent to you separately by your Home Authority, and your 11+ results letter, which you should already have received.

Each of Warwickshire's six grammar schools are their own admission authority and have set their own qualifying scores for 2015 entry. Each school also has its own over-subscription criteria which have been taken into account where there have been more applicants than places available.

The following information relates to your child's performance in the 11+ test and has been used to determine whether or not they are offered a grammar school place.

Please note that if you made a late application for any grammar preferences you may not have been considered in this round of offers.

If sufficient proof of address for Rugby High School or Lawrence Sheriff School was **not** supplied by 31/12/14, as per their admission arrangements, this preference will have been classed as late and you will have been notified of this previously in writing. This means that even if your child has reached the automatic qualifying score they may not have been offered a place at these schools.

Information on Qualifying Scores and Waiting List Ranges for entry in 2015

The following information outlines the automatic qualifying scores which have now been established for each of the six Warwickshire grammar schools as well as the criteria used when making offers for 2015 entry. Also included are details of the minimum score required in order to be placed on the waiting list for each of the grammar schools. These scores have been determined by a Committee of Reference as part of Warwickshire's Local Review Process.

Where a school has not been able to fill up to its Published Admission Number (PAN) using the automatic qualifying score, some offers may have been made to applicants scoring within the waiting list range. These offers are included in the column labelled 'lowest score offered'.

**Alcester Grammar School has a PAN of 120 places for 2015 entry. However, after discussion with the Local Authority, and in conjunction with the Local Review Process, the school and its governing body have decided to offer an extra 30 places resulting in 150 offers.*

Your child **will not** have been made a grammar school offer, even if they fall into one of the categories above or higher, if they have been made an offer for a school listed as a higher preference on your secondary school application.

It should also be noted that not all children within the lowest category offered for a particular school may have been made an offer. Where there are more applicants in the category than there are places available, the distance from the applicant's home address location to the centre point ("centroid") of the preferred school is taken into account. Please see each school's individual admission arrangements using the website links above for further information.

Waiting Lists

It may be possible for you to make a late preference for a Warwickshire grammar school, if you have not done so already, so that your child can be added to the relevant waiting list/s. If any places do become available, re-offers will commence from the 16th March 2015 and will continue as necessary until December 2015.

Waiting lists for the grammar schools will be held in score order only (highest score = highest priority) and a child's position is subject to change. **Please note that waiting list positions will not be available until the week commencing Monday 9th March.**
