Re: Warwickshire 11+ Qualifying Scores - September 2018 Entry

You are receiving this letter as your child, «ChildFname», sat the Warwickshire 11+ test for 2018 entry – a selective test which has, for this year of entry, been conducted as a shared testing process with The Grammar Schools in Birmingham foundation. If you have named a Warwickshire grammar school on your child's secondary school application, this information will explain how your application has been considered and outlines the score data which has been used, along with the over-subscription criteria for each of these schools, to allocate places.

This information should be considered alongside your secondary school offer letter or email - which will be sent to you separately by your home authority – as well as your 11+ results letter, which you should have received previously.

Each of Warwickshire's six grammar schools are their own admission authority and have set their own qualifying scores for 2018 entry. Each school also has its own over-subscription criteria, which have been taken into account where there have been more applicants than places available.

The following information relates to your child's performance in the 11+ test and has been used to determine whether or not they have been offered a grammar school place.

Information on Qualifying Scores, Waiting List Ranges and Offers

The following information outlines the automatic qualifying scores which have now been established for each of the six Warwickshire grammar schools, as well as the criteria used when making offers for 2018 entry. Also included are details of the minimum score required in order to be placed on the waiting list for each of the grammar schools. These scores have been determined by a Committee of Reference as part of Warwickshire's Local Review Process.

Please note that only those applications for places at the Warwickshire grammar schools which are classed as on time will have been considered at this stage. Late applications for grammar school places will be considered **after** 19 March 2018.

Your child <u>will not</u> have been made a grammar school offer (even if they fall into one of the categories outlined below, where offers have been made) if they have been made an offer for a school listed as a higher preference on your secondary school application.

Late Applications

Applications have also **not** been considered in this first round of offers where **either**;

- your secondary school application was submitted late to your home authority (ie: after the National deadline of 31 October 2017), or
- where you registered late for the 11+ test (ie: past the deadline of 7 July 2017), or
- where you did not submit satisfactory documentation in support of the address which has been used on your application, by the relevant deadline of 29 December 2017

If your child has not been considered in this first round of offers, for one or more of these reasons, and they achieved at least the 'minimum waiting list score' as outlined above, then they will automatically be added to the waiting list of any grammar school which you have named on your application. Late applications for grammar school places will be considered

after 19 March 2018. From this date, any vacancies that have become available after 1 March will be filled from the waiting lists.

Please note that individual scores for children receiving an offer for a grammar school under Pupil Premium, LAC or EHCP criteria (Categories 1 and 2) are not published in this data due to Data Protection legislation.

Category 1 of each school's over-subscription criteria relates to children who are in the care of the Local Authority or who were previously looked after, as defined by the School Admissions Code (2014).

Children with a statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education, Health and Care Plan will only be allocated a place if they meet the academic requirements of the grammar school for which an application has been made.

It should also be noted that not all children within the lowest category offered for a particular grammar school may have been made an offer. Where there are more applicants in the category than there are places available, the distance from the applicant's home address location to the centre point ("centroid") of the preferred school is taken into account, along with the score obtained in the 11+ test. Please see each school's individual admission arrangements using the website links above for further information about each school's admission arrangements for this year of entry.

Waiting Lists

It may be possible for you to make a late preference for a Warwickshire grammar school, if you have not done so already, so that your child can be added to the relevant waiting list/s. Please contact your home authority to discuss this further.

If any places do become available at any of the grammar schools then re-offers from the waiting lists will be made <u>from</u> the Monday 19 March 2018 (please note: re-offers from the waiting lists will not necessarily be made <u>on</u> this date), as part of one of three specific reallocation rounds. The second reallocation round will then commence from 9 April and the third reallocation round will commence from 7 May. If there are any further re-offers to make after this time then applicants will be considered as and when vacancies become available.

Waiting lists for the grammar schools will be held according to the admission arrangements and over-subscription criteria for each grammar school, and a child's position is subject to change. Please note that waiting list positions for the grammar schools will not be available until the week commencing Monday 12 March.
