

What is a Rugby Advertiser cuttings Volunteer?

A Local History Volunteer who indexes Rugby Advertiser cuttings helps the Library Service by recording cutting details in an Access database, making the information more accessible to the public. This role has been specifically developed to tackle a significant donation from the Rugby Advertiser.

What's in it for you?

- Working on a specific project independently
- Adding resources to the Local History collection for posterity to be used by the local community
- Learn more about your local area

What's involved?

With guidance and training from library staff, the volunteer will:

• Take an existing cutting, check master list and select a heading or create a heading (following guidance given) and record the information in the database

This role will suit people who

- Are aged 18 or older
- Are able to follow guidelines and instructions
- Are methodical, concise and are able to check their work to ensure accuracy
- Have sound ICT skills, in particular working with Microsoft Office Applications
- Have an interest in the history of the local area
- Have confidence to undertake a task independently
- Have good communications skills and are able to explain to members of the public what is involved in their library volunteer role
- Have a basic understanding of how the Library Service operates, either in general terms or from personal experience
- Have the ability to cope with the duties and responsibilities of the role and the associated environment, including an understanding of health and safety
- Are willing to wear a library volunteer badge in a public space
