

What is an Indexing Newspapers Volunteer?

A Local Studies Volunteer who indexes newspapers helps the Library Service by making library resources more accessible for newcomers and existing customers.

What's in it for you?

- Expanding your knowledge of the local area; people, events, and places
- Finding out about the period of time the newspaper is from
- Learning how to use a basic Access database
- Creating something useful for customers

What's involved?

With guidance from library staff, the volunteer will:

- Find local births, deaths and marriages listed in local newspapers on microfilm
- Record information about the individuals by hand on paper, following specific instructions
- Log on to a library computer and add the information to an Access database

This role will suit people who

- Have strong research skills or have undertaken family history, historical or other research
- Are able to follow guidelines and instructions
- Are methodical, concise and are happy to check their work to ensure accuracy
- Have a passion and enthusiasm for history
- Are happy to undertake a task independently
- Will not be upset by reading potentially disturbing information (for example, reports relating to an accident, death or war)
- Have a basic understanding of how the Library Service operates, either in general terms or from personal experience
- Have the ability to cope with the duties and responsibilities of the role and the associated environment, including an understanding of health and safety
- Have sound ICT skills, in particular; working with Microsoft Office Applications
