ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS STREETS, COLESHILL) (PROHIBITION OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLES OF OVER 7.5 TONNES) ORDER 2004

The Warwickshire County Council in exercise of its powers under Section 1(1) and (2), 2(4) and 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

- In this Order, "heavy commercial vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 138 of the Act;
- 2. Save as provided in Article 3 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause any heavy commercial vehicle to proceed in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause a heavy commercial vehicle to proceed in any of the lengths of road referred to therein if the vehicle is being used:-
 - (1) for or in connection with the conveyance of goods to or from any premises situated on, or adjacent to, any of those lengths of road;
 - (2) for the purposes of agriculture on any land adjacent to that length of road/any of those lengths of road or for or in connection with conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;
 - in connection with the carrying out on, or on premises situated on or adjacent to, any of those lengths of road of any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations.
 - (ii) the removal of obstructions to traffic,
 - (iii) maintenance, improvement, repair or reconstruction work, and
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration, or repair in, or in land adjacent to any of those lengths of road, of any sewer, or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas or electricity, or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act, 1984;
 - (4) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
 - (5) to proceed to or from any premises which are situated on, or adjacent to any of those lengths of road and at which the vehicle is to be, or has been, garaged, serviced or repaired;

- (6) in the service of a local authority or a water undertaker or sewerage undertaker or the Environment Agency in pursuance of statutory powers or duties which are being undertaken on any of those lengths of road or on adjacent land or premises.
- (7) for or in connection with the conveyance of goods for sale from the vehicle on any of those lengths of road or;
- (8) in connection with a circus, fair, market or similar event to be held on, or in the vicinity of any of, those lengths of road.
- 4. The Council is satisfied that for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order run/s by restricting the use on those lengths of road by heavy commercial vehicles, it is requisite that Section 3(1) of the Act should not apply to this Order.
- 5. This Order shall come into operation on the 20th December 2004 and may be cited as "The Warwickshire County Council (Various Streets Coleshill) (Prohibition of Commercial Vehicles of Over 7.5 Tonnes) Order 2004".
- 6. The County of Warwick (High Street, Coleshill) (Prohibition Of Driving Heavy Vehicles) Order 1961 is hereby revoked.
- 7. The County of Warwick (Rose Road, Coleshill) (Prohibition of Driving Heavy Vehicles) Order 1962 is hereby revoked.
- 8. The County of Warwick (Hall Walk, Coleshill) (Prohibition of Driving Heavy Vehicles) Order 1965 is hereby revoked.
- 9. The Warwickshire County Council (B4117 Lichfield Road, Coleshill) (Prohibition of Commercial Vehicles of Over 7.5 Tonnes) Order 1989 is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

Lengths of Road in Coleshill

1. Hall Walk

The entire length.

2. High Street

- (i) From its junction with Station Road to the south side of its junction with Birmingham Road and Blythe Road.
- (ii) From the north side of its junction with Birmingham Road and Blythe Road to its junction with Sumner Road.

3. Lichfield Road

From its junction with the A446 Little Packington to Weeford Trunk Road to its junction with Station Road.

4. Rose Road

The entire length.
