The Warwickshire County Council in exercise of its powers under sections 1, 2 and 4 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. The Warwickshire County Council (Various Streets, Coleshill) (Prohibition of Commercial Vehicles of over 7.5 tonnes) Order 2004 (which said Order is hereinafter referred to as 'the Principal Order') is hereby varied in the manner and to the extent hereinafter provided.
- 2. In the Schedule to the Principal Order delete Items "2(i)" and "2(ii)" relating to High Street, Coleshill.
- 3. In the Schedule to the Principal Order add Item 5 as described in the Schedule below.
- This Order shall come into operation on the Two thousand and twenty one and may be cited as "The Warwickshire County Council (Various Streets, Coleshill) (Prohibition of Commercial Vehicles of over 7.5 Tonnes) (Variation No. 1) Order 2021".
