### **HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 90G**

#### **AUGUSTA PLACE, LEAMINGTON SPA - PROPOSED FOOTWAY BUILD OUT**

Warwickshire County Council propose, pursuant to section 90G of the Highways Act 1980, to install a build-out (traffic calming feature), the effect of which would be to widen the footway adjacent to St Peters Catholic Primary School, as described in more detail in the Schedule below.
