ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, KENILWORTH) (TRAFFIC REGULATION) (PART 1) ORDER 2008

The Warwickshire County Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

1. (1) In this Order:-

"the 2002 Regulations" mean the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002:

"the cycle lane" means the area of carriageway on the west side of Southbank Road, Kenilworth which extends from its junction with Station Road northwards for a distance of 11 metres and indicated by a road marking complying with diagram 1057 of the 2002 Regulations;

"pedal cycle" has the same meaning as in Regulation 4 of the 2002 Regulations.

- (2) Except where otherwise state any references in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order.
- 2. Save as provided in Articles 4 and 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause any vehicle to proceed in any of the lengths of road specified in Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order in a direction other than that specified in relation to that length of road in Column 2 of that Schedule.
- 3. Save as provided in Articles 5 and 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle, other than a pedal cycle, to enter, proceed or wait in the cycle lane.
- 4. Nothing in Article 2 shall render it unlawful for any pedal cycle to proceed in the cycle lane in a northerly direction.
- Nothing in Article 3 shall render it unlawful for a person to cause or permit any vehicle to enter, proceed or wait in the cycle lane for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle to be used:-
 - (1) for the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (2) for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;

- in the service of a local authority or water undertaker, or sewage undertaker in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, or in connection with the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or of any main pipe, apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984; provided that whilst being so used it is necessary for the vehicle to wait in the cycle lane; or
- (4) to avoid an accident.
- 6. Nothing in Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall apply to the driving of any mechanical road cleansing vehicle.
- No person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to make a right hand turn from Station Road, Kenilworth into Warwick Road, Kenilworth.
- The provisions of this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of the provisions of any regulation made or having effect as if made under the Act or under any other enactment.
- 9. This Order shall come into operation on the 2nd day of June Two thousand and eight and may be cited as "The Warwickshire County Council (Various Roads, Kenilworth) (Traffic Regulation) (Part 1) Order 2008".

(i)	Bertie Road, Kenilworth – from its junction with Waverley Road, to a point 35 metres south of its junction with Station Road	Northerly
(ii)	Southbank Road, Kenilworth – from a point 11 metres north of its junction with Station Road, to its junction with Station Road	Southerly
(iii)	Station Road, Kenilworth – between its junctions with Bertie Road and Waverley Road	Easterly
(iv)	Station Road, Kenilworth – from a point 54 metres north-east of its junction with Warwick Road, to its junction with Warwick Road	South-Westerly
