ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
((D4090 CROSS STREET AND D4129 ST JOHNS SERVICE ROAD, WARWICK)
(ONE WAY TRAFFIC) ORDER 2025

The Warwickshire County Council in exercise of its powers under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, hereby make the following Order:-

1. Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, cause any vehicle to proceed in those lengths of road described in column 1 of the Schedule below, otherwise than in the direction described in relation to that length of road in column 2 of the Schedule below.
2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall apply to the driving of any mechanical road cleansing vehicle.
3. This Order shall come into operation on the First day of October Two thousand and twenty-five and may be cited as "The Warwickshire County Council (D4090 Cross Street and D4129 St Johns Service Road, Warwick) (One Way Traffic) Order 2025".




