ADVANCE WORKS NOTICE

Re: **D49 Birchmoor Road, Polesworth – Carriageway and footway resurfacing works**

As part of Warwickshire County Council's highways maintenance programme, the Council is working in partnership with Balfour Beatty Living Places to invest in and maintain the local highway network.

We are writing to inform you about carriageway and footway resurfacing works planned near your property.

Location and duration

The works will take place from **29th July until 7th August 2026, from Cockspur Street to the allotments.**

Works will be carried out under a road closure, with working hours **between 08.00 – 17.00, weekdays only**. Restrictions will apply during working hours only.

What is carriageway resurfacing?

Carriageway resurfacing involves removing the top layer of the road and replacing it with new surfacing material to restore the condition of the road.

These works typically include:

- Removal of the existing worn surface
- Repairs to any localised defects
- Laying new asphalt surfacing
- Reinstatement of road markings and ironwork where required

These improvements will:

- Provide a smoother and safer surface for road users
- Improve skid resistance and overall road safety
- Extend the life of the carriageway
- Reduce the need for more extensive repairs in the future

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What are footway reconstruction works

Footway reconstruction involves removing and rebuilding the existing pavement structure to improve its condition and safety.

These works typically include:

- Removal of the existing surface and underlying layers
- Repair or replacement of the foundation
- Installation of new surfacing materials
- Resetting kerbs where required

These improvements will:

- Provide a safer surface for pedestrians
- Improve accessibility for all users
- Extend the lifespan of the footway
- Enhance the overall appearance of the area

What to expect

Please be aware that the dates in this letter may change due to weather conditions or other operational requirements. For the latest updates, please check our yellow advance warning signs or view the scheme on one.network using the QR code above.

During the works:

- Access to properties will be maintained wherever possible, although short delays may occur
- Refuse collections will continue as normal
- On street parking may be temporarily restricted within the works area
- There may be noise from construction vehicles and equipment

What residents need to do

To enable us to carry out these works safely and efficiently, we kindly ask residents to ensure that **any vegetation** from your property that overhangs the footway is cut back in advance of the works. This includes shrubs, hedges and any overhead foliage, which can restrict access for our workforce.

To help us complete the works safely and efficiently, please:

- Avoid parking where no waiting cones are in place
- Move vehicles away from the works area in advance
- Follow temporary traffic management and signage
- Keep children and pets away from the site and equipment
