ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

**THE WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
(BOROUGH OF RUGBY) (CIVIL ENFORCEMENT AREA)
(WAITING RESTRICTIONS, ON STREET PARKING PLACES AND
RESIDENTS' PARKING) (CONSOLIDATION) (VARIATION O) ORDER 2026**

STATEMENT OF REASONS

1. BACKGROUND

Warwickshire County Council is proposing to make a Traffic Regulation Order, pursuant to section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to introduce no waiting at any time restrictions at the locations specified in the Schedule.

This scheme is proposed under a developer led scheme, under a Section 278 agreement. This development involves the demolition of disused lock up garages and converting the area into a parking facility for a school drop off-pick up zone. It has the application reference RBC/23CC006.

2. LEGAL FRAMEWORK

In deciding whether or not to make a Traffic Regulation Order, the Council is required to have regard to the matters set out in section 122 of the 1984 Act. Section 122(1) requires the Council to exercise the functions conferred on it by the 1984 Act as (so far as practicable having regard to the matters specified in section 122(2)) to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians), and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway.

The matters to which the Council must have regard are:-

- the desirability of securing and maintaining reasonable access to premises
- the effect on the amenities of any locality affected and the importance of regulating and restricting the use of roads by heavy commercial vehicles so as to preserve or improve the amenities of the areas through which the roads run
- the national air quality strategy prepared under section 80 of the Environmental Protection Act 1995
- the importance of facilitating the passage of public service vehicles and of securing the safety and convenience of persons using or desiring to use such vehicles
- and any other matters appearing to the Council to be relevant

Therefore, whilst the overall objective of the Council must be to secure the expeditious convenient and safe movement of vehicular traffic this will sometimes need to give way to the objectives in section 122(2) and a balance has to be achieved between the overall objective and the matters set out in section 122(2).

Warwickshire County Council is proposing to make this Traffic Regulation Order based on the following legal grounds under the 1984 Act:-

- *for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or*
- *for facilitating the passage on the road or any other road of any class of traffic (including pedestrians), or*
- *for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs*

It is proposed to introduce 'No Waiting At Any Time' restrictions signalled by double yellow lines on Holbrook Road at its junction with the Access Road to Long Lawford Primary School Car Park and on both sides of the Access Road to Long Lawford Primary School Car Park.

This is intended to prevent parking at the junction and along the access road which will allow for unobstructed access to the car parking and improve visibility and safety for all road users including pedestrians and cyclists.

The Council, as the Traffic Authority, is required to have regard to its duty under section 16 of the Traffic Management Act 2004, to manage the local road network to achieve as far as possible:

- securing the expeditious movement of traffic on the local road network; and
- facilitating the expeditious movement of traffic on road networks for which another authority is the Traffic Authority,
- having had regard to its other obligations, objectives and policies as far as possible.

The Council is required to have regard to its duty under section 149 of the Equality Act 2010 in the making of these proposals, and give regard to advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it, and in particular, to the need to:

- remove or minimise disadvantages suffered by persons who share a relevant protected characteristic that are connected to that characteristic;
- take steps to meet the needs of persons who share a relevant protected characteristic that are different from the needs of persons who do not share it;
- encourage persons who share a relevant protected characteristic to participate in public life or in any other activity in which participation by such persons is disproportionately low.

Thorough consideration was given to the factors set out in Section 122 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Section 16 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 in proposing this Traffic Regulation Order.

Thorough consideration was given to the equality's duty of the Council under Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010.

3. SCHEDULE

3.1. No Waiting At Any Time

Holbrook Road

West side, from a point 9 metres north of the access to Long Lawford Primary School to a point 8 metres south of the access to Long Lawford Primary School.

Access Road to Long Lawford Primary School Car Park

- (i) North side, from its junction with Holbrook Road, westwards for a distance of 25 metres.
- (ii) South side, from its junction with Holbrook Road, westwards for a distance of 48 metres.

4. Existing Order to be varied.
