Reminder about Transforming Care

- Transforming care is trying to get care and support right in the community, so that people can stay in their own homes even if they are feeling a bit unwell.
- Transforming care is trying to make sure that people only go to hospital when they really need to and that they don't stay for longer than necessary.
- We have been asked by the NHS to reduce the number of people in Coventry, Warwickshire and Solihull who are in hospital to 37

Things we have done since June 2017

- We have started working with new organisations who have lots of experience working with the most complex people in the community.
- They are working with 17 people in hospital to find them houses and choose a team of staff who have similar interests to look after them in their own home.

More things we have done since June 2017

Training:

- We want to make sure that the people caring for people with LD/ASD know how to be the best they can.
- Social workers have had extra training in understanding people with Autism. We hope that this will mean only the people who really need to go to hospital get admitted.

More things we have done since June 2017

Working together to make services better at helping those with LD/ASD:

- When someone is admitted, learning what went well and not well and sharing that information with health and social care colleagues.
- Working more with CWPT to make plans together to improve how we care for people with LD/ASD

More things we have done since June 2017

Transforming Care Register:

- Health and Social care seeing the same information about those who need to most help in the community
- This means that they can work together and quickly plan the care and support that will keep somebody safe in their own home.

Plans for next 6 months

New Services to prevent admissions:

- An Intensive Support service to give people more care and support in their home when they are very unwell or have just left hospital.

We will be working with CWPT to have an Intensive Support Service for:

- People with ASD only
- Children and Young people
- People who have been in trouble with the police and need more help to keep them safe in the community.

Plans for the next 6 months

Training:

- Some teachers will be teaching the parents of children with Autism to understand their child better.
- The parents will learn how to help their children to cope with their feelings and with things they find difficult.

People in hospital

- There are more people in hospital than there were in June.
- More children are going into hospital and more people are going in for a short time to be assessed than in June.
- Less people are going into hospital and staying there for a long time.
- We are discharging very complex people who have been in hospital for many years.
- There have been no admissions to secure hospitals.
