We rely on documents cited in the Ramblers' application of August 2005 (their ref. SD141; WCC ref MZ601) for the addition of this public footpath to the Definitive Map of Warwickshire, viz:

- The claimed path is first recorded on an estate map of 1810 (County Record Office CR936 (on shelf)). This map shows all the paths outside the area of common open fields, including the existing, recorded, path to the church (SD 62) by pecked lines. It also shows a short section of the claimed route (our ref. SD Claim 144) in the common field area.
- 2) The eastern section of this route was specifically created by the "Whitchurch Inclosure Award 1869 (CRO OS75/127). The text describes it as a "Public Footway 4ft wide 8 on the map from Preston and Crimscote Road north east along the boundary of the Hamlet of Crimscote ' to a point opposite Birchfurlong Cottages at OS ref 231478..
- 3) The Tithe Apportionment Map for Whitchurch (Altered) 1873 (CR569/262) shows the same route as on the estate map of 1810, but with the whole length of the awarded path as well. It is considered that the awarding of the path and its depiction on this Tithe Map firmly establishes that the claimed route is a public path.
- 4) The whole route is continuously shown on all subsequent large scale Ordnance Survey maps from the first edition of the 6 inch ma of 1884 (sheet 50NE), where it is labelled 'fp', onwards.
- 5) The forms for the 1910 Finance Act for much of the county have not been sorted in to parishes and. therefore. are not available.
- 6) The creation of part of the claimed route by the Inclosure Award, and the showing of the whole route on the Tithe Map, is almost the same evidence as was accepted in a successful case in North Warwickshire and, therefore, it is considered that there is more than sufficient evidence to reasonably allege that this path subsists as a public right of way,
- 7) There is no record of this path being legally closed or diverted, either at Quarter Sessions or subsequently.

We note that our application establishes a footpath that deviates from the historic routes defined above and marked on OS maps in pecked lines. We explain the deviation in our application, forced upon us by obstruction of the historic route at several places. We claim the route marked in red on our map by continuous usage over thirty-five years. In asserting our right to walk this
