The purpose of this form is to gain as much information about the route claimed as possible. Please complete the following sections in as much detail as you can.

 Please explain why you believe the Definitive Map and Statement should be modified, for example, why you believe the route should be added to the map or should be upgraded.

This application is based on the previous long use of a short section of tarmac road at the entrance to Thwaites estate. We are making this application for safety reasons to avoid a dangerous road.

On the 27th of February one of the owners of Thwaites estate posted that they were going to enforce the fact that the public access through the main entrance was by footpath only, therefore excluding cyclists and horse riders. They were contacted at the time and asked to meet to discuss the safety implications of riding down a busy road to the official bridle path. An offer was also made to fund and arrange improvements to the muddy gateway. Both these offers were declined.

Cyclists and horse riders from Harbury, and surrounding villages, have used this short length of road as long as anyone can remember to access the existing bridlepaths on this estate. Many families in the village were taught to ride their bikes on this road and are now teaching their own children. It is also used by people in wheelchairs and disability buggies. It is a quiet, safe almost traffic free road as on a private estate.

The relevant section is only 0.3 miles until it joins an existing bridlepath. it is on tarmac road so apart from the entrance they are no gates or stiles.

There are no safe alternative access routes, there are two bridlepaths which link to the estate but both on these are on a now busy road, with blind corners. This makes it very dangerous for horses and bikes. The bridle paths are also over muddy or ploughed fields which are totally unsuitable for most cyclists.
