PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDERTOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1968 - SECTION 94Rural District of Atherstone (Footpath T74 (Part)) Public Path
Temporary Diversion Order, 1972

WHEREAS the Atherstone Rural District Council are satisfied that it is necessary to divert the footpath to which this Order relates in order to enable development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1962 or the enactments replaced by that part of that Act.

NOW THEREFORE, the Atherstone Rural District Council in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by section 94 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1968 hereby make the following Order:-

1. The footpath over the land situate at Dosthill shown by a bold black line on the map annexed hereto and described in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be diverted as provided by this Order.
2. There shall be created to the reasonable satisfaction of the Atherstone Rural District Council an alternative highway for use as a replacement for the footpath referred to in Article 1 above as specified in and over the land described in Part II of the Schedule hereto and shown by bold black dashes on the map contained in this Order.
3. The diversion of the footpath referred to in Article I above shall have effect on the confirmation of this Order.
4. The following works shall be carried out in relation to the highway described in Part II of the Schedule hereto, that is to say, provide and erect a six feet high chain link fence on the northern side of section E-D to the footbridge, between the footpath and the proposed excavation; provide and erect a five feet high post and wire fence on the southern boundary to the footpath; provide and erect two pairs of six feet high access gates where the footpath crosses the accommodation roads; make a cutting through the existing spoil heap for a distance of 40 feet; clear vegetation from the footpath line; make good the footpath surface, where necessary; and provide direction signs to the satisfaction of the Atherstone Rural District Council.
5. Stoneware Limited, Dosthill are hereby required to pay the cost of carrying out the above-mentioned works and also the Council's costs in making and advertising the Order.
6. This Order may be cited as the Rural District of Atherstone (Footpath T74 (Part)) Public Path Temporary Diversion Order, 1972.

PART IDescription of Site of Existing Path

That part of footpath T.74, approximately three feet wide, commencing at Point B on the map (such point being situated on the eastern boundary of Ordnance Survey Parcel number 5059, which point is also on the boundary dividing the administrative areas of the Rural District of Atherstone and the Borough of Tamworth) and from there running eastwards for approximately 166 yards to the Rural District/Borough boundary at Point C on the map, which point is approximately 130 yards from the railway bridge at Rush Lane, Dosthill.

PART IIDescription of Site of Alternative Highway

A footpath, approximately three feet wide, commencing at Point E on the map (such point being situated on the Rural District/Borough boundary and being south of Point B) and from Point E running across an accommodation road and a spoil heap to the north of the kilns owned by Stoneware Limited and terminating at the Rural District/Borough boundary at Point D on the map, which point is situated at the eastern end of a new footbridge over the railway sidings and accommodation road off Rush Lane, Dosthill, the total distance of the diversionary route being approximately 280 yards.
