

## 2021 Census data: Exploring Warwickshire household and resident characteristics

$\boldsymbol{A}$

Warwickshire is **growing faster** than the **national average** in terms of residents and households.

Warwickshire's ageing population is growing. 1 in 5 residents (122,615) are aged 65+.

2 in 3 households have **fewer than 3 people**.

An increase of 2.3 percentage points in 2011

An increase from 115 residents in 2011



Warwickshire's younger population is growing at a lower rate than nationally.

Between 2011 and 2021 the number of males aged 85 and over increased by 42.9%.

Females make up almost two thirds of residents aged 85 and over; numbers increased by 12.7% since 2011

## 2021 Census data: Exploring Warwickshire legal partnership status for those aged 16 and over


The **largest group** with 235,473 residents were those who were **married**.

48% were married, a decline from 51% in 2011.

1 in 3 people aged 16+ have never married or entered a registered civil partnership

An increase of 3.3 percentage points compared to 2011.

Same sex marriage was legalised in 2014 and opposite-sex civil partnerships were legalised in 2019.





**1,099** residents were in a marriage between same sex couples.



**345** residents were in civil partnerships between opposite sex couples.



The number of same-sex civil partnerships went down from 732 in 2011 to 515, suggesting some couples opted to get married using the new legislation.

# **2021** Census data: Exploring Warwickshire household composition



#### Households with higher rates of growth:

- 1. Co-habiting couples
- under the age of 66 (with and without children) increased by almost one third.
- 2. Lone parents with non-dependent children
- 3. Households where all residents were 66 years or over

#### **One Person Households**

The proportion of one person households in Warwickshire is at a similar level to 2011. However, growth has been higher in one person households aged 66 and over compared to one person households with younger occupants.

#### **Dependent Children**

Approximately, 28% of households contained dependent children in 2021, a similar level to 2011.
