



## 2021 Census data: Exploring Warwickshire migration using country of birth and passports

**1 in 8** Residents were born outside of the UK



12.5% compared with 8.3% in 2011. Nationally, the figure is 16.8%.

### Top 3 countries of birth

Residents who make up 1 in 3 of those born overseas



India - 10,702 | 56% increase



Poland – 9,765 | 65% increase



Romania – 6,503 | 1658% increase

% increases are between 2011 to 2021

The increase in residents born in Romania was the most notable of any country and follows the national picture of change; working restrictions for Romanian citizens in the UK was lifted in 2014.

### Passports



**1 in 7** Residents did not have any passport

A reduction from 17.7% in 2011 to 14.1% in 2021



**3 in 4** Residents held a UK passport

The proportion of residents holding a UK passport is broadly the same as in 2011



**2 in 3** Non-UK passports held by residents were EU passports.

- There has been an increase in the number and proportion of non-UK passports held by Warwickshire residents.
- Those holding non-UK passports increased by 91% from 26,066 residents in 2011 to 49,784 in 2021; 8.3% of residents held a non-UK passport compared to 4.8% in 2011.

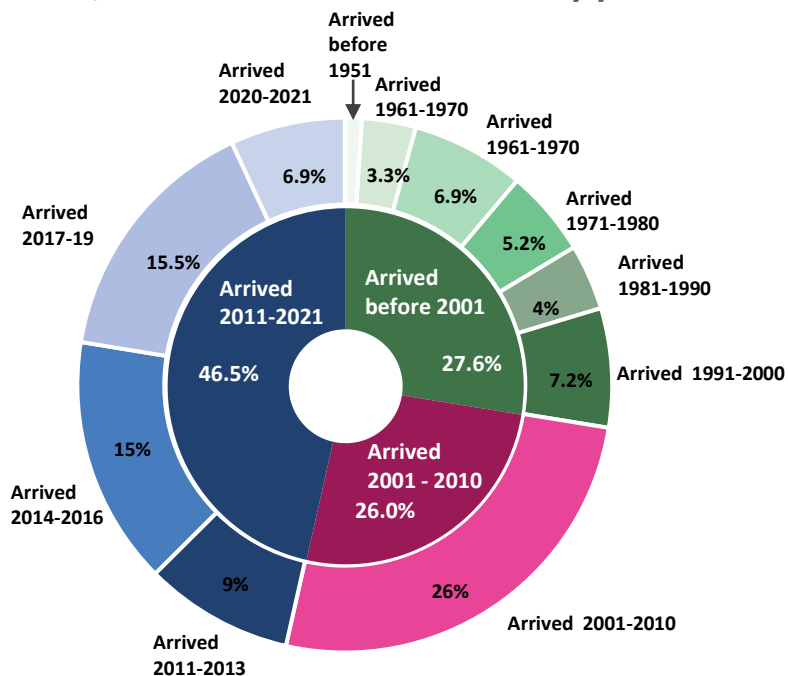
Country of birth is a preferred measure of long-term migration as a person's place of birth does not change. Country of birth does not denote nationality and the two may be different.

Passports held is a further measure of migration statistics. It is often a proxy for nationality. Residents with dual/multiple nationalities are not counted twice but are categorised as either UK, Irish or Other country passport holders.



# 2021 Census data: Exploring Warwickshire migration using year/age of arrival and address one year ago

## % of the 74,688 overseas-born residents by year of arrival



58,120 (9.7%) residents had a different address **in the UK** one year before 2021 Census day



An increase of 3.5% from 56,132 in 2011.

4,502 residents had a different address **outside of the UK** one year before 2021 Census day



A slight decline on 2011 levels when it was 4,539 residents.

- Address one year ago provides an indicator of movement of people both within and outside of the UK in the one-year period before the census.
- A lower number of arrivals from outside of the UK in the year prior to 2021 was expected, likely caused by travel restrictions in place because of the coronavirus pandemic; Warwickshire is in line with the national picture.

Almost half of residents born overseas arrived in the 10-year period before 2021



Nationally the figure is lower at 42%.

9,685 International migrants were aged **0-4 years**



An increase of 40% or 2,753 children since 2011.

3 in 4 International migrants were **under the age of 30 years**



Those aged under 30 years contribute the highest volumes of international migrants but by a smaller proportion than in 2011.

**Aged 30 years+**



International migrants **aged 30 and over** increased by **125%**

International migrants were older in 2021 compared to 2011. A higher proportion were aged 30 and over.
