# 2021 Census data: Warwickshire's Labour Market: Economic Activity

### **Economically active: in employment**

**58.1%** of residents aged 16 or over were economically active: in employment (excluding full time students)

Total of **284,849** residents at the time of the Census 2021 Ranked **48<sup>th</sup> highest** out of 177 county / unitary LA's across England and Wales 2.4 percentage points higher than the national average (55.7%)

#### Definition

Economically active: in employment (an employee or self employed).

# **Economically active: unemployed**

**2.2%** residents aged 16 or over were economically active: unemployed (excluding full time students)

Total of **10,924** residents at the time of the Census 2021 Ranked **30<sup>th</sup> lowest** out of 177 county / unitary LA's across England and Wales

0.7 percentage points lower than the national average (2.9%)

#### Definition

Economically active: unemployed (those who were looking for work and could start within two weeks, or waiting to start a job that had been offered and accepted).

# **Economically inactive**

**37.8%** of residents aged 16 or over were economically inactive

Total of **185,669** residents at the time of the Census 2021 Ranked **60<sup>th</sup> lowest** out of 177 county / unitary LA's across England and Wales

**1.3 percentage points** higher than the national average (39.1%)

#### Definition

People aged 16 or over are considered economically inactive if, in the week before Census 2021, they were not in employment and they were: not looking for work or looking for work, but were not able to start in the next two weeks.

### 2021 Census data: Warwickshire's Labour Market: Travel to work

Just over a third of residents worked mainly from home at the time of the Census 2021. Of those that did travel, the majority travelled less than 20km

### The main mode of transport for residents was driving a car or van to work at the time of the Census 2021
