



English Indices of Deprivation 2025

Headlines for Warwickshire

Background

The English Indices of Deprivation 2025 (IoD25) were published by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG) on 30th October 2025. These statistics update the English Indices of Deprivation 2019.

The IoD25 can be used to identify the most deprived neighbourhoods and relatively compare areas across England, explore the domains (or types) of deprivation, and compare larger administrative areas.

New datasets, methodologies and geographies have been used to produce the IoD25, meaning outputs are less directly comparable to previous versions of the IoD. Changes in rank and decile positions over time may be influenced by changes to geographies and administrative boundaries, enhancements to data, processing and methods used to produce the IoD25 rather than, or in addition to, real change in deprivation levels. This should be considered when looking at comparison between IoD25 and IoD19.

Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD2025)

The English indices of deprivation measure relative deprivation in small areas in England called lower-layer super output areas (LSOAs). The index of multiple deprivation (IMD) is the most widely used of these indices and combines several distinct domains of deprivation—such as income, employment, health, education, housing, crime, and living environment—into a single overall measure.

Warwickshire and districts and boroughs

Although calculated at LSOA level, MHCLG also publishes rankings for lower tier local authorities (LTLAs) and upper tier local authorities (UTLAs) which are based on either average rank or average scores of their constituent LSOAs. The average score is used in this section as is generally preferred when you want to reflect the overall level of deprivation in an area.

Warwickshire's rank against other UTLAs has stayed very similar across the last three editions of the IMD moving from **124** out of **152** UTLAs in 2015, to **121** out of **151** UTLAs in 2019 and then to **122** out of **153** UTLAs in 2025.

Looking at LTLAs, when comparing IMD 2025 with IMD 2019, Table 1 shows that taking into account both rank and total number of LTLAs, North Warwickshire Borough has become relatively more deprived over time compared to other LTLAs in England. In contrast, Rugby Borough, Stratford-on-Avon District and Warwick District have become relatively less deprived compared to other UTLAs. Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough has had less change, although remains the relatively most deprived LTLA in Warwickshire.

Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs)

Deciles split all areas into ten equal groups, from the most to the least deprived: **decile 1** is the most deprived 10% of areas in England, **decile 2** is the next most deprived 10%, and so on.

In 2025, in Warwickshire there are 51 LSOAs out of 354 LSOAs in the 30% most deprived LSOAs in England (in deciles 1-3) which is 14.4% of all LSOAs. In 2019, there were 48 LSOAs out of 339 LSOAs in deciles 1-3 which was 14.2% of all LSOAs.

Table 2 shows the number of LSOAs in deciles 1, 2 and 3 in each borough and district in Warwickshire, both in 2025 and in 2019. Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough and North Warwickshire Borough have more LSOAs in deciles 1-3 in 2025 compared to 2019, whilst Stratford-on-Avon District and Warwick District have fewer.

In Warwickshire, in 2025, **2.5%** of the 354 LSOAs are in the most deprived 10% nationally. Broken down by LTLA, **8.3%** of the 84 LSOAs in Nuneaton and Bedworth Borough, **2.6%** of the 38 LSOAs in North Warwickshire Borough and **1.1%** of the 88 LSOAs in Warwick District were in the most deprived 10% nationally. Figure 1 shows the number and proportion of LSOAs in each decile in Warwickshire as a whole and in each district and borough.

Figure 1: Proportion and number of LSOAs in each decile, within each district and borough across Warwickshire

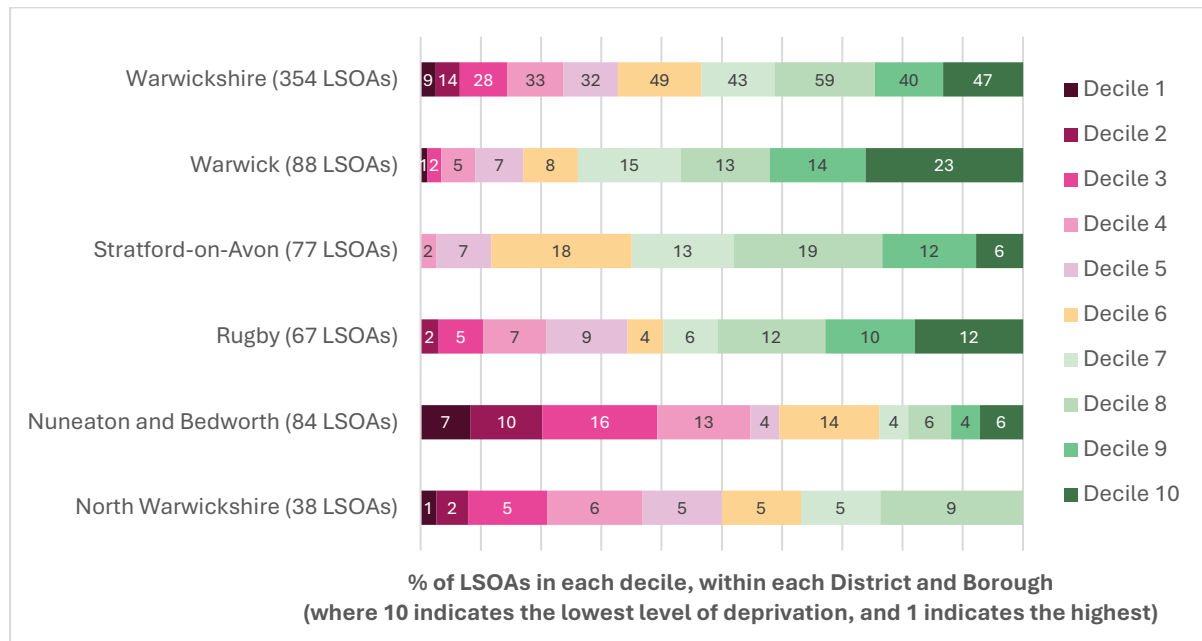


Table 3 presents an analysis of changes in the relative deprivation of neighbourhoods within Warwickshire across deciles. The table illustrates the numbers of LSOAs in each decile of the IMD25 and their corresponding deciles according to the IMD19. The dark green cells show the number of LSOAs that have remained in the same decile. The pink cells show the number of LSOAs that have become relatively more deprived since IMD19 whilst lighter green cells show the number of LSOAs which have become relatively less deprived since IMD19. Overall, 175 (49.4%) LSOAs have stayed in the same decile, 98 (27.7%) LSOAs have moved to a more deprived decile and 81 (22.9%) LSOAs have moved to a less deprived decile.

Table 4 lists the LSOAs in Warwickshire that are in the 20% most deprived LSOAs in England and compares their rank in 2025 to their rank in 2019. All LSOAs in decile 1 in IMD 2025, apart from Middlemarch & Swimming Pool, are relatively more deprived than they were in 2019. In decile 2, eight out of the 14 LSOAs have become relatively more deprived whilst six have become relatively less deprived. Note that although Bede North and Rugby Town Centre ranking has increased, their percentile position is slightly lower.

Three LSOAs moved from decile 2 in 2019 to decile 1 in 2025, and two LSOAs moved from decile 3 in 2019 to decile 2 in 2025. The LSOAs with the largest changes in rank were Bede - Bedworth Town Centre in Nuneaton & Bedworth Borough (3,010 decrease and a move from decile 3 to decile 2); Brownsover South - Lake District North in Rugby Borough (1,982 decrease, remaining in decile 2); Ansley Common & Birchley Heath in North Warwickshire Borough (1,782 decrease and a move from decile 3 to decile 2); and Atherstone Town Centre in North Warwickshire Borough (1,702 decrease, remaining in decile 2).

Population numbers in the most deprived neighbourhoods

Table 5 shows the number and proportion of the population in the most deprived 10%, 20% and 30% LSOAs in Warwickshire and in each of the boroughs and districts in Warwickshire. Overall, in Warwickshire, 13.6% of the population live in a neighbourhood which is in one of the 30% most deprived LSOAs in England.

Domains of deprivation

There are seven domains of deprivation that make up the overall Index of Multiple Deprivation. The domains are combined using the weights in brackets:

- Income (22.5%): Measures the proportion of the population experiencing deprivation relating to low income.
- Employment (22.5%): Measures the proportion of working age population involuntarily excluded from the labour market.
- Education (13.5%): Measures the lack of attainment and skills in the local population.
- Health (13.5%): Measures the risk of premature death and impairment of life quality through poor physical/mental health.
- Crime (9.3%): Measures the risk of personal and material victimisation at local level.
- Barriers to housing and services (9.3%): Measures the physical and financial accessibility of housing and local services.
- Living environment (9.3%): Measures the quality of both the 'indoor' and 'outdoor' local environment.

Table 6 shows how many LSOAs are in the most deprived 20% for each domain. There are also two supplementary indices: Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI)- this measures the proportion of all children aged 0 to 15 living in income deprived families; and Income Deprivation Affecting Older People (IDAOP) – this measures the proportion of those aged 60+ who experience income deprivation. The number of LSOAs in the most deprived 20% in each supplementary indices are also summarised in Table 6.
