## **Patterns**


All Aboriginal designs have a story behind them. These are dot paintings, they can be painted on rocks, wood and in caves.

Look around to see what patterns you can find indoors and outdoors.










In Japan, gravel is raked to produce wonderful patterns.


The ripples represent water, these gardens are called 'Karesansui' or zen garden.


