Statement of Evidence for Path Claim RAP 8

- The section of the path in Rugby appears to be that created by the Rugby Inclosure Award 1774 (held by the Warwickshire County Record Office at QS75.93) as the fourth public footpath, being 4 ft wide. It was described as going 'from the south side of the Homestead or Garden of Thomas Miller near the south-west corner of the Town of Rugby, to a stile in Bilton being the footway towards Dunchurch'.
- 2 The path is shown on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1887) from the south end of Union Street to Overslade Road.
- 3 The section south of Sow Brook was diverted by The Dunchurch Road Estate, Rugby Diversion Order 1939 (WCRO: QS47/391). This (diverted) part is shown on the Definitive Map as part of RB41. The path was described as going from Union Street to Overslade Lane, with the whole route being shown on the plan.
- 4 The southern end of the path was diverted by another Quarter Sessions Highways Order of 1952 (WCRO: QS47/416), when the new width was given as 4 ft 6 ins. Only part of this path is shown on the Definitive Map, as part of RB 41.
- 5 The unrecorded section of the path has a well maintained, tarmac, surface with cycling barriers and signs, and modern street lights.
- 6 It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
