## Statement of Evidence

- 1) This short track, which forms the vehicle access to College Farm, also forms the link to the junction of paths W98 and W99a, which suggests that this stub was believed to be a highway when the Definitive Map was originally prepared.
- 2) This stub is shown on the 1<sup>st</sup> edition of the Ordnance Survey one inch map of 1831 as part of the road network in the area, and on all subsequent large scale Ordnance Survey maps up to the present day.
- 3) The Tithe Apportionment map of 1841, for Wasperton, (County Record Office CR569/256) also shows the route as an integral part of the road network, being part of item 220. This is described in the Book of Reference as "Town Streets and Lanes" under the general heading of Roads and Wastes, none of which were titheable. This strongly suggests that the road was a public highway.
- 4) In addition, this Tithe Map also shows the routes of "footways", all of which are now recorded on the Definitive Map as public paths, with only slight changes to their alignments in some cases. In the present case, path W98 and part of W99a from the main Wellesbourne Road to just south of the present College Farm is shown as a private road going to the Vicarage, with W99a (then on an alignment slightly within the field) clearly shown as crossing this driveway and terminating on the end of the stub road. This clearly supports the case for the stub being a public road.
- 5) The map prepared under the 1910 Finance Act shows that this stub was excluded from the adjoining landownerships, a situation confirmed by the landownership information shown on planning applications.
