



The purpose of this form is to gain as much information about the route claimed as possible. Please complete the following sections in as much detail as you can.

1. Please explain why you believe the Definitive Map and Statement should be modified, for example, why you believe the route should be added to the map or should be upgraded.

The footpath has been used continually in living memory of villagers (going back 70+ years). It has been clear on old maps an aerial photos, as well as having been signposted with an oak finger post for a considerable time. For some reason it was not fully recorded as a Public Footpath, and the width was never recorded at all.

From A to B the footpath has run between property boundaries. This section is not currently shown in the Definitive Map and Statement.

From B to D the footpath has run through a grassed paddock. This section is shown in the Definitive Map and Statement, but no width is recorded. A current planning application is attempting to move the footpath into a narrow strip right up against the fence to the north. However, this is not the route which is/has been used, and nor is it the route shown on old aerial photos and maps. In particular the walked route through the paddock varies according to season and grass growth, and the waymarker post in the path is a good 3+ metres from the fenceline. In particular, near point D, the boundary is a large Leylandii hedge which grows out at least one metre into the paddock.

We believe that the footpath should be recorded with a width of at least 3 metres between B and D.

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On the main road through

Start point the village Grid Reference. 415381 248624 i)

at the far side of the paddock,

- End point about 130 metres from the Grid Reference 415508 248621 ii) main road
- iii) Are there any gates / stiles / bridges? Please describe where (it would be helpful to mark them on a map).

There is an unlocked foot gate (with a stile adjacent to it) where the path enters the paddock, at the start of the recorded section of SD40.

There is an unlocked gate at point D where the path leaves the paddock

Can the route be used today? Yes iv)

- are you aware of when any obstruction occurred?

There is a timber finger post at the main road. (point A)

There are waymark discs on the gate. (point B)

There is a waymark post part way through the paddock. *(point C)

There are waymark discs where the path leaves the paddock (point D)

What is the surface type of the route? It would be helpful to mark it on a map. vi)

The first 60 metres (to point B) is crushed stone laid over a geotextile. Until mid-

December this was a trodden muddy path between hedges.

The next 5 metres or so is boggy mudwhere heavy machinery has bee used and turne The remaining 65 metres is a grassy paddock.
