
- 1. Please explain why you believe the Definitive Map and Statement should be modified, for example, why you believe the route should be added to the map or should be upgraded.
- 1.1 The current Definitive Map shows the eastern section of public footpath W123 on an incorrect alignment following a draughtman's error in the 1960s probably following the Special Review of the Definitive Map required by the 1968. Countryside Act (the 1968 Act). See the broken black line A B on the accompanying map. The solid black line C D is the correct and historic alignment.
- 1.2 The way appeared on its correct alignment in the first edition, Ordnance Survey 1:2500 map in 1887-9. This was prior to the construction of Dunbar House, the neighbouring properties or any of the present property boundaries.
- 1.3 The same alignment appeared on the second series Ordnance Survey 1:2500 map of 1905 and also on the 3rd edition, Ordnance Survey 1:2500 map of 1925.
- 1.4 The same alignment appeared on the 1938 edition of the Ordnance Survey 1:10560 (6 inch to the mile) map but the 1939 1:2500 map did not include it at all and it did not appear again on any Ordnance Survey base maps unlike the western section from Lewis Road, Radford Semele to the intersection with W122c. Although the new boundaries surrounding Dunbar House did not appear on the 1930s maps, it is likely that some of them had appeared by then.
- 1.5 Following the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act 1949, the Parish Council were invited to claim public rights of way for inclusion in the first Definitive Map. This they did using a linen-backed, Ordnance Survey base map presumably supplied by Warwickshire County Council. In fact, the base map issued was an old edition (probably a 1938, 1:10560 edition).
- 1.6 The effect of using an old base map was, that the Parish Council were able to claim the exact line of the historic route and this was entered on the Definitive

Map in c. 1954.

- 1.7 Schedule 3 of the 1968 Act, required a special review of public rights of way primarily to re-classify the old designation of Roads Used as Public Paths (RUPPs) which were to become either public footpaths, bridleways or Byways Open to All Traffic. It is likely that as a result of this, the Warwickshire Definitive Map was re-drawn, probably on an Ordnance Survey 1:10560 scale map from c. 1955. On this map, the public footpath formerly shown on the early editions by a double row of pecked lines did not appear. Some of the original boundary features of Dunbar House were included though.
- 1.8 Without the guidance of the Ordnance Survey base map, the 1960s draughtsman re-drew the line of public footpath W123 in error. At 1:10560, the difference is barely perceptible. However, he made two errors which, while small for the techniques of the day, have the effect of placing W123 several metres to the north the north-eastern termination point being the worst with the footpath meeting the Southam Road approximately 50 metres from where it should.
- 1.9 The first, tiny mistake was in placing the western intersection with W122c approximately 10m north of its correct position which should have been directly opposite the intersection point between W122c and the western section of W123 from Radford Semele.
- 1.10 The second mistake was in the alignment of the eastern arm of W123 which should have been 061.5 degrees north but was in fact drawn at 055 degrees north. It is this error which, over a long length, multiplied the effect.
- 1.11 The combined effect of these errors is to place W123 on completely the wrong alignment as it crosses the garden of Dunbar House.
- 1.12 The present Definitive Map should be modified and corrected because it seeks to establish a public right of way that has no other legal or historical basis and, in so doing, has a detrimental effect on the value of the property. It also has important repercussions for the security of the property which has been the subject of at least one break-in in recent times.
