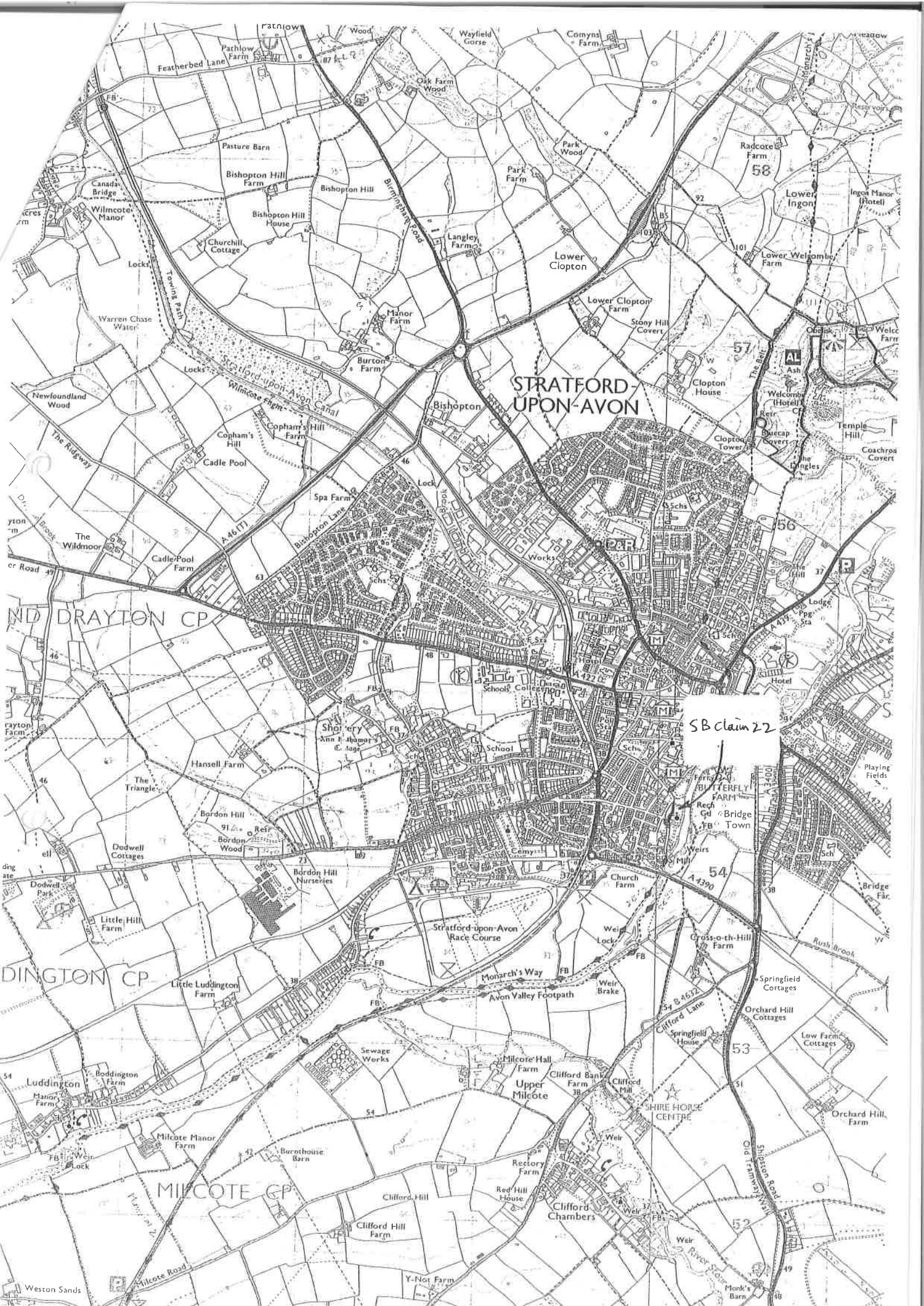

Statement of Evidence for SB Claim 22

- 1 The route was created by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order of 1808, although it was also described in the Order as being "another old legal Foot Way leading through the Parish Church Yard". (Held by Warwickshire County Record Office at QS47/Roll 2 m.16.)
- 2 The route is shown on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1886) as skirting around the end of the church.
- 3 There is part of a gate at the south end, and a double gate at the north end, of the churchyard, the surface being paved and lit.
- 4 It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
