Statement of Evidence for S B Claim 5

- 1 The path is the continuation of the recorded path SB43 through the early suburbs of the town.
- 2 The east end of the route, at Evesham Place, is labelled on a Quarter Sessions Highways Order of 1808 as "Cotterells Stile". (Held by the Warwickshire County Record Office at QS47/Roll 2 m.16.)
- The route is shown on the deposited plans for the Oxford Worcester and Wolverhampton Railway (branches) 1853 (2nd Deviation). The Book of Reference describes parcel 16 as 'Public Footpath', with the owners being the Surveyor of Highways and the Local Board of Health. (Held by WCRO at QS111/218.)
- 4 The route is shown on the deposited plans for the GWR (Stratford Lane) 1854. The Book of Reference describes parcels 45 + 47 as 'arable and footpath'. (Held by WCRO at QS111/220.)
- 5 The path is shown as an enclosed route, crossing the railway, on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1886).
- 6 The path has a good, tarmac, surface with bollards, a chicane, modern street lights, a telegraph pole, and a signpost pointing to 'Anne Hathaway's Cottage' at Grove Road.
- 7 It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
