Statement of Evidence for Path Claim S B Claim 10

- 1 The route is the continuation of the recorded public footpath SB40 north, under the Relief Road, to Mill Lane.
- The path, although not shown, is described as the continuation of a path being diverted in 1808, namely going from "Stratford on Avon to Clifford Chambers". (Held by the Warwickshire County Record Office at QS47/32 Roll 2 m.16.)
- 3 The route is shown on the deposited plans for the East and West Junction Railway 1863. The Book of Reference describes parcel 34a as 'pasture field and public footroad', the owners including the Local Board of Health. The parcel to the south. Leading to the footbridge over the river, shows the path on the plan as parcel 34a. (Held by WCRO at QS111/262.)
- 4 The path is shown as an enclosed route from Mill Lane to the Foot Bridge, and then as a pecked line under the railway, on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1886).
- 5 The path generally has a good, tarmac, surface with a 'no cycling' roundel and a bollard at the north end.
- 6 It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
