Statement of Evidence for RA ref. SD Claim 30

- 1) The claimed route was laid out as a public bridleway in the Ettington Inclosure Award of 1797 (County Record Office QS75/45) where it is described as going "To Thornton Gate".
- 2) The route is shown on an 'outline' map of the parish, showing the inclosures (CR229/117/12), in the same way as SD76 and SD75, and is also shown on another plan showing all the inclosures, and old inclosures (CR229/117/4+5). This plan shows all the awarded paths and describes the claimed route as "Bridle and Foot Road to Thornton". All of the other paths shown are recorded as public paths on the Definitive Map (i.e. SD68, SD69, SD67, SD67c/a/b, and SD65).
- 3) The route is shown on the deposited plans for the London, Worcester, Rugby, Oxford Railway 1844 (QS111/147) where it is labelled '7' in the parish. This is described in the Book of Reference as 'bridleway', with the owner being given as the Surveyor of Highways. (SD76 is given the reference '9a' and is also described in the same way.) The route is shown as continuing from the site of the gate mentioned in the Inclosure Award to the Thornton Farm complex.
- 4) The route is also shown on the plan for the Warwickshire and London Railway (Worcester to Weedon Section) 1845 (QS111/180). The reference book describes it as "Public Bridle Road", with the owner being given as the "Surveyor of Highways". Path SD76 is also shown and labelled in the same way.
- 5) A third deposited plan, for the East and West Junction Railway (No.1) 1862 (QS111/249) again shows the route and is described under two separate sections, the part in Thornton being given as a "Public Bridle Road" with the part towards Ettington being given as "Public Bridle Road and occupation road". The owner is given as the Surveyor of Highways.
- 6) The southern part of the claimed route is shown on all the larger scale Ordnance Survey maps, from the first edition of 1886.

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
