Statement of Evidence for Southam Claim No.9

- 1) This claimed bridleway is the continuation of the already recorded bridleway in Hornton parish and is shown on a map of Ratley of 1791 (County Record Office ref. CR620/1) in the same way as all other roads in the area.
- 2) It was created by the Ratley Inclosure Award of 1796 (QS75/91) where it is the first awarded bridleway. It is described as "one public bridleway 12 feet broad from Ratley Towns end near the church in its ancient direction into Oxhill Lane then to the Bridle Gate in the parish of Hornton, being part of the public Bridle Road from Ratley to Hornton".
- 3) Details of the route can be identified through the fact that two of the awarded private roads are stated to include parts of the bridleway. The routes of these can be identified through reconstructing the Inclosure Award map and by reference to estate maps in the County Record Office. A copy of this reconstructed map has been deposited at the Record Office.
- 4) The start of the claimed route, by the church, is shown on an estate map of 1808 (CR45 Bundle 3 (map 1)) while almost the whole route (excluding this end) is shown on another estate map, of 1819 (Z86(u)). Most of it is shown as being outside the estate, with the first part as an enclosed lane, the next part on the adjoining estate of John Sydenham, and the last part on the estate itself as an enclosed strip labelled "Bridle Road" going "To Hornton".
- 5) The route is also shown on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey one inch to a mile map (c.1840) as well as on all the larger scale maps, including the first edition of the 6 inch to a mile map of 1886.
- 6) The map prepared under the 1910 Finance Act shows the first, enclosed, section from Ratley as being excluded from the hereditaments to the north and south (despite the description of the first private road in the Inclosure Award) and this is continued through to the present day with it not being included in the Land Registry recorded title.
