TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF PUBLIC FOOTPATHS N57, N57A & N11 IN THE PARISH OF ARLEY

Warwickshire County Council made a Temporary Traffic Order closing Public Footpaths N57, N57a & N11 in the Parish of Arley, to all traffic.

The closure was required for the safety of the public whilst drainage and maintenance works were being carried out to the embankment either side of the railway.

The Order commenced on 25 January 2019 and was due to expire 25 July 2019. However, the Secretary of State in exercise of his powers under Section 15(5) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 has directed that the Order shall continue in force until 24 January 2020 or until the works to which it relates are completed, whichever is the earlier (unless the Secretary of State issues a further direction).

Please note: Weather permitting, it is anticipated that the works will be completed by 6 September 2019.

Access to and egress from properties and land situated adjacent to the length of footpath to be closed, if any, will be maintained where possible.

An alternative route will be signed and is available via: R57a and a permissive route across private land.
