SNT with the support of incident resolution will conduct 20 dedicated patrols of Southam and surrounding areas. They will liaise with other forces to assist with reduction of burglaries and gain intelligence and promote Neighbourhood Watch Scheme's where appropriate.



Priority Three

Anti-social behaviour

SNT to identify hotspot areas, conduct 10 patrols, identify issues and deal robustly.

Suggested Priorities (1)

Rural crime patrols

Conduct a minimum of 20 high visibility patrols within the rural community in an effort to deter acquisitive crime and to offer crime prevention advice where needed.





Suggested Priorities (2)

Speeding Bishops Itchington

Conduct a minimum of 6 speed checks across the beat area and deal with any recorded offences. Educate drivers on the dangers of speeding within our towns and villages.



Suggested Priorities (3)

Speeding in Warwick Road Southam

Conduct a minimum of 6 speed checks across the beat area and deal with any recorded offences. Educate drivers on the dangers of speeding within our towns and villages.





Suggested Priorities (4)

Drugs issue and misuse

Gather intelligence about drug issue and misuse, conduct drug tests on suspected drivers.



Suggested Priorities (5)

Anti social behaviour (ASB)

Identify hotspot areas, conduct patrols and engage with local youths. If appropriate obtain their details if suspected of ASB and liaise with partner agencies for help dealing with the issues.
