32 Traffic Offence Reports issued.

25 vehicles issued a Illegal Parking Notices or verbally warned.

19 Letters sent out to car owners on reports from members of the public.

1 request for driver to produce documents at a Police Station.

14 drivers reported for the offence of Failing to turn left where required.



Worn road markings were reported to Highways via Fix My Street on 18th February, we are still awaiting completion of the work.

This has divided public opinion as well as being praised, we have been criticised for enforcement, mainly on social media. But we have seen a reduction in offending of late.

A day after the last forum, two vehicles were issued Illegal Parking Notices advising them not to park opposite the junction of Oak Avenue.

Other good results on area, include...



-Gathering and developing intelligence on cross border and drug related criminality.

After meeting with Severn Trent Water, barriers have been installed at Shustoke Reservoir to prevent ASB, Drug taking, fly tipping and it developing into a Public Sex Environment.

-Working with local businesses and County Council Highways in relation to the A446 Stonebridge Road Public Sex Location.

-Solar Security lights given to vulnerable burglary victims.

-We have been working hard at the Corley Services Police Post trying to bring it up to date and a usable base for the team as well as Traffic and Response officers.

-Many patrols in highly populated areas put in for Operation Manteline in response to recent terror attacks.

Unexplained Death Investigation - Appeal for information.

Police are appealing for information after a woman's body was found in a house on Comish Close, Nuneaton on Saturday (17 June) night.

The body of 27-year-old Dionne Clark from Nuneaton was discovered at the house on Saturday. Paramedics attended but she was pronounced dead at the scene.

At this stage police are treating the death as unexplained and are carrying out enquiries to establish exactly what occurred. An initial post mortem was inconclusive and further tests are being carried out to establish a cause of death.

A 19-year-old woman and a 28-year-old man, both from Nuneaton, have been arrested on suspicion of murder and perverting the course of justice in connection with death. The currently remain in police custody.

A 33-year-old woman from Nuneaton arrested on suspicion of murder has been released under investigation.

Following further enquires; a 54-year-old man and 58-year-old woman from Nuneaton have also been arrested on suspicion of perverting the course of justice and remain in police custody.

Detective Inspector Anna Middleton of the Major Investigations Unit, said: "We are also appealing to anyone who may have found the deceased phone, a Samsung Galaxy, which may have been discarded near to the rocks at Manor Court School."

- We are aware of recent wave of acquisitive crime in and around the Coleshill area, which has resulted in thefts of expensive pedal cycles and cars. We are trying our best to build intelligence and put in patrols at key times to protect the public. Please help us by reporting suspicious activity.
- We have numerous complaints of parking outside all of our schools. We are hoping to implement an "across the board" strategy and work with Highways over the summer to improve road markings to make our children safer on their journeys to and from all the schools.
- We are hoping the decriminalisation of on road parking offences comes into play soon. There is no other area in Warwickshire where this is yet to be implemented. If this burden was shared with Traffic Wardens, we would be able to focus more on tackling crime on the area.
