Community Priority One

To detect and deter traffic offences on Newbold

Road, Rugby

Result

14 dedicated patrols on Newbold Road, 2 speed checks conducted, school parking patrols outside of Newbold Riverside Academy, numerous warnings issued for parking offences on Newbold Road and tickets issued for unnecessary obstruction

Community Priority Two

To detect and deter parking offences in the Benn area.

Result

Numerous patrols conducted around Benn beat including the crossing on Murray Road and outside St.Andrews Benn. 10 tickets issued for unnecessary obstruction.

Community Priority Three

To carry out 5 dedicated patrols outside Boughton Leigh and Brownsover Community School to detect and deter parking issues.

Result

13 dedicated patrols conducted outside both schools, numerous parents spoken to and advised on suitable parking and 3 tickets issued for unnecessary obstruction

Vehicle checks on Boughton Road

On Thursday 27th April 2017 PC Ketley and PC Baker conducted a joint patrol targeting HGV's in contravention of the weight restriction on Boughton Road and Newton Manor Lane. This is after an increase in complaints from residents living within the area. In the space of one hour, four vehicles were ticked for breaking the weight restriction on Boughton Road. PC Ketley said that "statement" letters have been delivered to the transport managers at the nearby industrial estates and further patrols will be conducted over the next few months. It is hoped that this will elevate the issue of vehicle over 7.5 tonne bypassing the Leicester Road/Technology Drive by using Boughton Road. Further checks have been done by PC Crouch on Saturday 29th April 2017.
