## **KENILWORTH COMMUNITY FORUM**

**12<sup>th</sup> September 2017** The forum was attended by 35 people.

Item	Discussion points and actions agreed		
Welcome & Introductions	Cllr Kate Dickson welcomed everyone and opened the meeting.		
	The notes from the last meeting were agreed.		
	There were no other matters arising not already covered in the agenda.		
Police & Crime Commissioner (PCC)	Policing in Kenilworth		
	Philip Seccombe presented on his role and duties as Police & Crime Commissioner for Warwickshire. He introduced a new Police & Crime Plan and highlighted key areas of work he is looking to prioritise; which includes the implementation of a new policing model.		
	The model includes making saving targets to the policing budget; introduction of a Victim's Code; and opening of Operations Communications Centre at Warwick Technology Park		
	He also promoted grant funding and community engagement opportunities and introduced new Deputy PCC, Rob Tromans.		
	<ul> <li>In response to questions:</li> <li>Look to include in Road Safety Plan the recalibration of Speed Guns by police in support of local Community Speed Watch Groups</li> <li>Duty on Councils to target harden in response to encroachment by G&amp;T on open space eg Bates Memorial Park</li> <li>PC Anna Brown post is just short of Full Time at 36 hours per week. Anna covers only the Kenilworth beat. Crimes eg burglaries are investigated by a dedicated police team. There have been some recent arrests</li> <li>It was acknowledged that big events eg horse fair, agricultural show, carnival can all produce spikes in local crime figures</li> <li>Local policing is best done through the work of 33 Safer Neighbourhood Teams across the county. This structure of local policing will continue in Warwickshire. More 'Specials' will be recruited to support the Teams</li> <li>In response to crimes being committed from offenders from outside the area, local police forces use a crime management system called 'Athena' to help share information and profiles. It is expected to help significantly during construction of HS2 where plant machinery could be targeted by criminals</li> <li>To address safeguarding issues – cases are discussed between police, social services and health at regular meetings of Multi Agency Safeguarding Hub (MASH)</li> <li>Full support is offered to new and existing Neighbourhood Watch groups to enable residents to help themselves to reduce crime in their area</li> </ul>		

Kenilworth Safer Neighbourhood Team	<ul> <li>PC Anna Brown reported back on local police activity and handed out latest crime figures.</li> <li>The following points were made: <ul> <li>The increase in residential burglaries maybe due to offenders trying to find cat keys to steal cars parked on driveways / on-street parking</li> <li>In response to an increase in bike thefts the SNT team will look to organise a coding event</li> <li>In response to an increase in anti-social behaviour in Abbey Fields the police look at reintroducing the dispersal order</li> <li>A contributing factor to an increase in crime figures may be the change in reporting protocol</li> </ul> </li> <li>New forum priorities: <ul> <li>Community Reassurance / Burglary Prevention - Burton Green</li> <li>Theft and Anti-Social Behaviour - Kenilworth Town Centre</li> <li>Anti-Social Behaviour - Abbey Fields, Kenilworth</li> <li>Car parking issues – Kenilworth school</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
Plans for Kenilworth	Cllr George Illingworth updated on the following: Local Plan: In August the government's Inspector approved Warwick District Council's Local Plan. On 20 September the adopted Plan became the council's official policy to inform on planning decisions for the next twelve years. For more info: https://www.warwickdc.gov.uk/info/20410/new_local_plan Neighbourhood Plan: A revised Plan will be produced following consultation with residents and adoption of the Local Plan HS2: Enabling works including environmental mitigation works have now begun to prepare for the construction of the railway. Great Crested newts found on Kenilworth golf course. Two funding streams available: Community Environment Fund & Business and Local Economy Fund.
