Coaches are unpaid and are local volunteers committed to help wider take up of sport and activities of all ages in Barford.			
If you have applied for other grants for this work, tell us: • how much • where from • if the grant has been awarded			We trialled the use of temporary lights with 4 second hand ones last September costing £600. We received a £350 grant from WDC Sports Grant Fund in September 2017. This helped us trial the use of these lights for small groups over winter. Those lights were old, not that bright and we need new more powerful ones to add to existing to cover a much larger playing area. The other £250 was raised by volunteers as part of the trial. The existing lights are in need of replacement for next winter but they have been a great way of trialling the use of lights across part of the courts. They have also created local demand for evening use.



Adults and children have played together in netball and that has seen the sessions get stronger with a total of 22 netballers now in the group. Our junior football teams have grown from 12 – 40 in 6 months and we want to continue to encourage and support more people playing sport locally in Barford. All facilities are free so we have no way of funding new lights from income in such a short timeframe.
