Alzheimer's Research UK

There has been a 56% rise in the number of people diagnosed with dementia from 2010/11 to 2015/16.



The cost of dementia in the UK is expected to more than double in the next 25 years, from £26bn to £55bn in 2040.

One million

people in the UK will have dementia by 2025 and this will increase to two million by 2050.





Summary

Dementia concerns us today like cancer did 25 years ago

- Some are even scared of the word
- A lot of people live with dementia without it being diagnosed

Dementia tends to affect older people more than younger

- But that doesn't mean young people are <u>never</u> affected
- More people are living longer so more people will be affected by dementia
 - Being "affected" includes carers
- So what can we do?

Interacting with people living with dementia

It is better that people live independently with dementia for as long as possible and be able to function and mix socially and this is possible with just a little understanding from others.

Making Southam easier to navigate

- Making clearer street signs and notices
- Friendly help easily available with signs in homes, shops and pubs
- Planning provisions in Southam's Neighbourhood Plan
