Welcome	Cllr Wallace Redford welcomed everybody Minutes of last meeting were agreed. No matters arising
Local Policing	Sgt Chris Kitson reported back on local police activity and handed out monthly crime figures for January 2019 – August 2019
	PCSO Ed King has been awarded the Joanne Graham Award. The Award is presented to a Warwick District PCSO who shows exceptional commitment in helping protect their community. Cllr W Redford asked Sgt Kitson to pass on congratulations from the Forum.
	Limited number of speed checks were undertaken on Rowley Road, Baginton due to road works in September.
	Cannabis farm at an address in Stoneleigh has been dismantled by police.
	Rural Crime Inspector Allison Wiggins heads up Rural Crime Team based at Greys Mallory station, Bishop's Tachbrook. The team is dedicated to investigating rural crimes that impact the rural economy eg wildlife offences, violation to livestock, stealing farm machinery.
	PC Amy Poole previously with West Midlands police will soon take up the post vacated by PC Wendy Burrows for the Warwick Rural East beat.
	 In response to questions: Lead stolen from Weston-Under-Wetherley church roof is being investigated by the Rural Crime Team as a heritage crime Following the end of the alliance with West Mercia Police co-ordination of Community SpeedWatch will be the responsibility of PCSO Sharon Bailie-Crabtree based in Rugby.
	 New forum priorities: Crime prevention / reassurance patrols in Radford Semele Crime prevention engagement in WRE rural businesses Wildlife crime prevention patrols in WRE School safety patrols at Cubbington C of E Primary
Fire & Rescue Service	Station Commander Paul Whittaker based at Leamington fire station gave an update on the changing role of Warwickshire Fire and Rescue Service.
	Warwickshire's Chief Fire Officer is Kieran Amos (appointed March 2019) Paul oversees the operation of Leamington, Gaydon, Kenilworth and Wellesbourne fire stations. There are 17 fire stations across the County. 11,000 calls to WCC Fire & Recue Service were received last year including calls for

missing persons and road traffic accidents although incident calls are declining. Focus of operation is shifting towards reducing risk of fire: Over 6,000 residents have benefitted from 'safe & well visits' by fire officers All schools have received safety talks to pupils in Key Stage 1,2,3 2,400 pupils in secondary schools and colleges have been trained in CPR - Heart Shield scheme Arson Reduction Officer, Rebecca Roberts based at Justice Centre in Nuneaton deals with deliberately started fires 'Park it Right' stickers – used by officers carrying out street inspections to identify cars that are likely to cause an obstruction to fire tenders in an emergency Local intelligence from residents is valued by the fire service, in particular identifying poorly parked vehicles; void properties; abandoned rubbish sites Other areas of work include: Hospital to home service – fire officers take vulnerable residents back to their homes following hospital discharge freeing up ambulance and NHS resources. A safe & well visit can be carried out. In response to questions: Flood rescue is carried out by fire officers in still water only using dry suits Biker Down is a first aid course specific to helping motorcycle casualties. Julie Keightley reported back on behalf of Baginton PC on the purchase of a defibrillator which was fitted in June to the outside wall of Baginton Village Hall.
