Issues	Action Agreed
Speeding on Nuneaton Road	This has been raised as an issue with Mark Pawsey MP. Members of the Forum felt that Coventry Road was probably a greater priority. Police to look at speeding.
School Road, Bulkington Upgrade of zebra crossing to Puffin crossing	This was agreed in January 2014 and is scheduled for early 2015. Residents expressed concern at the length of time this was taking. WCC to investigate.
Road markings: White line for dropped kerb outside Village Centre Disabled parking bay outside the library	WCC to investigate
Barbridge Road school traffic parking too close to junctions – residents requested double yellow lines in this area	WCC to investigate.
People are driving over the pavement on Tamar Road and parking on the grass verge adjacent to the houses – is there anything such as Bollards which can be put in place to prevent this?	WCC Highways looked at the verges and could not see a problem. Residents are requested to provide photographic evidence of the issue to northernareateam@warwickshire.gov.uk
Parking Issues – enforcement of double yellow lines	WCC to provide information on the new parking enforcement scheme for the next meeting.
Footpath from Bulkington to Bedworth	Safety issues raised. WCC to investigate
Maintenance of Pond off Thornhill Drive, Whitestone	NBBC Parks to look at cleaning up the pond. Residents Group are looking at signage for the pond.
Pedestrian Refuge on Lutterworth Road	Due to limited funds this project is currently on the reserve list, but this will be reviewed in July 2015
Bulkington Town Centre – CCTV for the village shopping centre?	Cllr Beaumont to discuss with NBBC and local shops to look at options around this.
