Police Safer Neighbourhoods Team Update	

Thefts from vehicles had increased significantly in the Horeston Grange and Weddington areas over the last four months. Increase mainly attributable to thefts from vans.

A number of arrests have been made in relation to the thefts from cars/vans who were the main perpetuators. Residents were reminded to lock vehicles and to double check they are locked before going to bed and to be mindful where keys are left in the home for cars which have keyless entry as there is a view the use of scanners is on the rise.

Also a small increase in burglaries over the area, but no specific hotspots. In the main the properties were empty as victims were on holiday, residents reminded to ask neighbours to keep an eye on the property, assign a key holder, set up timings on lights etc to give the impression of occupancy.

Recent spate of thefts of bicycles at North Warwickshire and Hinckley College, police have clear CCTV image of person taking the bicycles and may launch appeal in local press.

Julie Green the new PCSO will be back covering the area soon.

Congratulations were passed onto Terry Harris and his Neighbourhood Watch Team who scooped the top prize "Best in Warwickshire". Individual awards also presented, the partnership award went to Paul Jarvis for all his hard work over the last fifteen years.

Gavin Scott will be popping into meet with the recognised neighbourhood schemes in the area and will be talking to local groups.

The recent spate of allegations of children being pursued and harassed has been fully investigated by the police, a special task force was set up, to look into every single incident reported since September 2014, which have all been thoroughly investigated. At this time no suspects identified and no arrests have been made.

20 new NW coordinators have been recruited; it has been a good year.
