What we set out to do, and why



Systemic issues in CAMHS

- Fragmented Commissioning
 - Six commissioning bodies
- Disjointed services
 - Investment fixed between tiers
 - Pathways and transitions
- Issues across the system
 - Waiting times
 - Relationships with partners



What we set out to do, and why

CAMHS Redesign

1. Redesign the CAMHS system across Coventry and Warwickshire from tiers 1-3

2. Develop options for joint commissioning





What we set out to do, and why

- CAMHS redesign Project Board
 - Coventry and Warwickshire CCGs and LA's
 - Also Public Health, Schools, Parents, NHSE

- Principles
 - Co-production
 - Outcomes based specification



Co-production

- Led by Young Minds
- Ran from Nov 2014 June 2015
- Workshops and surveys held with:
 - children and young people
 - Parents and carers
 - Referring agencies (e.g. schools)
 - Providers
- Over 700 people engaged
- Developed draft outcomes framework and key themes



Outcomes Framework

- Co-production of Draft Outcomes Framework with:
 - Six headline outcomes
 - Key features for the new service
- Associate Development Solutions:
 - Produced Detailed Outcomes Framework
 - Young person wrote child friendly outcomes
- Additional survey to refine: 140 responses



New CAMHS system

Themes

- Increased emphasis on prevention and early intervention
- Focus on building resilience
- Integrated working, especially with schools
- Systemic work with families and child's network
- Increasing age from 18 to 25
- Tierless service
- Support for complex and vulnerable children



Options Appraisal

Brought together work completed to date

- Case for change
- Co-production and outcomes framework
- Market testing
- Indicative financial envelope
- Commissioning options



Options Appraisal

Recommendations:

- a) Outcomes Framework: to adopt the Detailed CAMHS Outcomes Framework;
- **b) Outcomes based specification**: to develop an outcomes based specification for the future CAMHS model;
- **c) Payment mechanism**: for the Board to continue to pursue a capitated payment mechanism as the preferred payment mechanism;
- d) 0-25 provision: to commission a CAMHS system that meets the needs of people from birth up to the age of 25;
- e) Contract mechanisms: For Providers to adopt either a Lead Provider or Alliance contract mechanism to deliver the redesigned CAMHS system;
- f) Lead commissioner: to establish two lead commissioning bodies (one for the Coventry city boundary, and one for the Warwickshire County boundary) with a Joint Working Agreement between them and a CAMHS Joint Commissioning Board to provide oversight;
- **g) Process Route**: To enter into a competitive dialogue process to procure the redesigned CAMHS contract in accordance with the Public Contracts Regulations 2015.

In the meantime: CAMHS Transformation Funds

- Five year national funding announced with publication of *Future in Mind* in March 2015
- Guidance and local funding announced in August 2015
- Deadline for submissions: Sept 2015
- Funding released October 2015.



Local Transformation Funding

Allocated to CCGs on a pro-rata basis:

South Warwickshire CCG: £484,000

Coventry and Rugby CCG: £878,000

– Warwickshire North CCG: £366,000

- Overall: £1,728,000

(per annum for five years)



Local Priorities

Years 1 and 2 priorities:

- 1. Specialist CAMHS waiting times
- 2. ASD diagnosis waiting times
- 3. Crisis support for acute hospitals
- 4. Eating Disorders

Funding in future years will support the transformation to the new contract.



CAMHS Waiting Times

Proposal headlines:

- Aim to reduce follow up waiting times to within 12 weeks.
- 17 week trajectory to reduce waiting times

Current position:

 Some posts recruited to, still recruiting to remaining posts.



ASD diagnosis waiting times

Proposal headlines:

- Aim to reduce follow up waiting times to within 12 weeks.
- 52 week trajectory to reduce waiting times

Current position:

- Most posts recruited to
- Additional funding being sought to increase trajectory and reduce waiting times faster



Crisis support for acute hospitals

Proposal headlines:

- Existing service running since 2015
- Operates across UHCW and Warwickshire Hospital
- Has reduced self harm admissions and time spent in Wards
- All young people seen within 48 hours (usually within 24)



Eating Disorder service

Proposal headlines:

- Enhanced community eating disorder service to reduce admissions into in-patient units (or reduce length of stay)
- Waiting times to be within four weeks

Current position:

 Half of posts recruited to, recruitment ongoing for ret of team



Key points:

- CAMHS Redesign Process has developed co-produced Outcomes Framework
- Competitive Dialogue Process is underway to identify lead provider for single contract
- 3. New contract to commence on 1st August
- 4. National Transformation funding being used in the interim to reduce waiting times
